Presenter Guidelines

IMPORTANT! PLEASE READ!!

1. Make sure your presentation is set to stretch to the full resolution of your screen when played. This is not always the default setting in Apple Keynote. Please prepare your presentation for a 1024x768 resolution. Presentation computers (Mac or PC) will be provided by the conference organizers.
2. Make sure your slides are legible to people in the back of a large room. A good rule of thumb is to avoid using any font sizes smaller than 18 pt. If your slides are legible to the people in the room, they will be legible on our video format. Otherwise, they will not be legible on our format nor to the conference attendees.
3. If you wish to point to specific areas on a slide, it is better to use your mouse pointer than a laser pointer, so that it can be captured by our down-converter for the benefit of your online audience.
4. When you receive a question from the audience, be sure to repeat it so that other people in the room can hear it. Our microphones do a pretty good job of picking up audience participation, but people in the room will not be able to hear far-away questions.
5. This form must be signed before your presentation can be recorded. Copies will be available during the conference.
